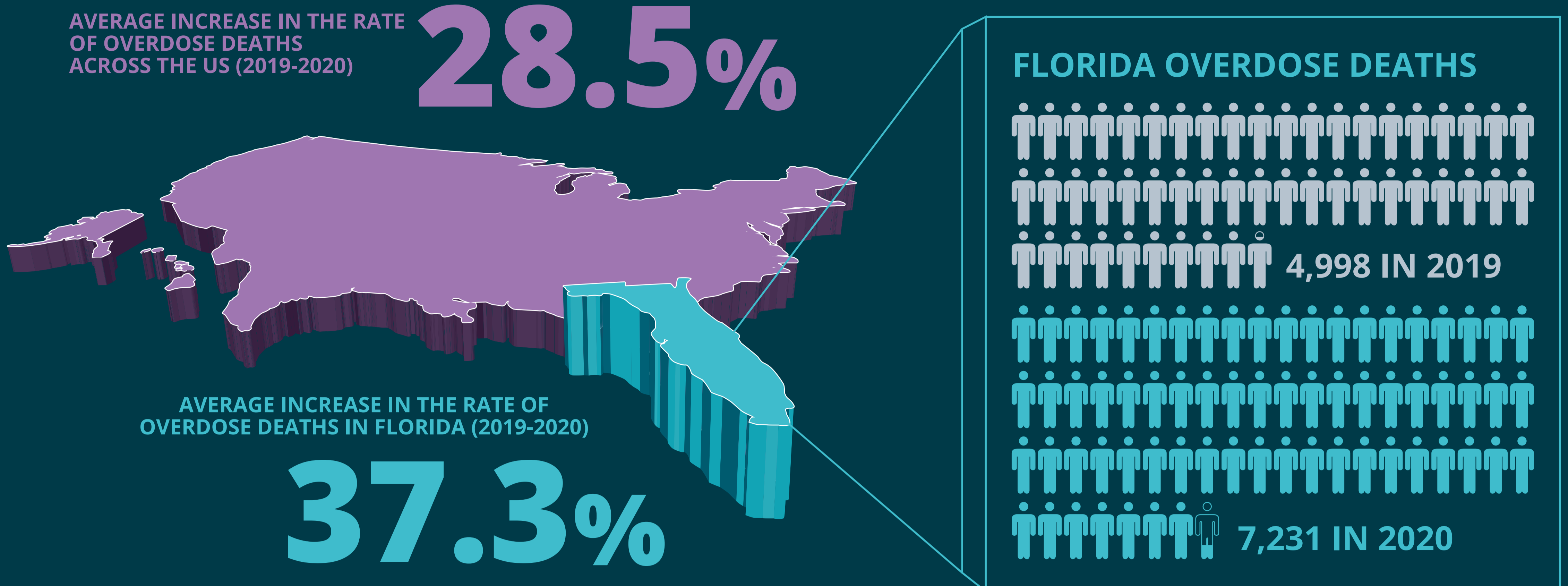


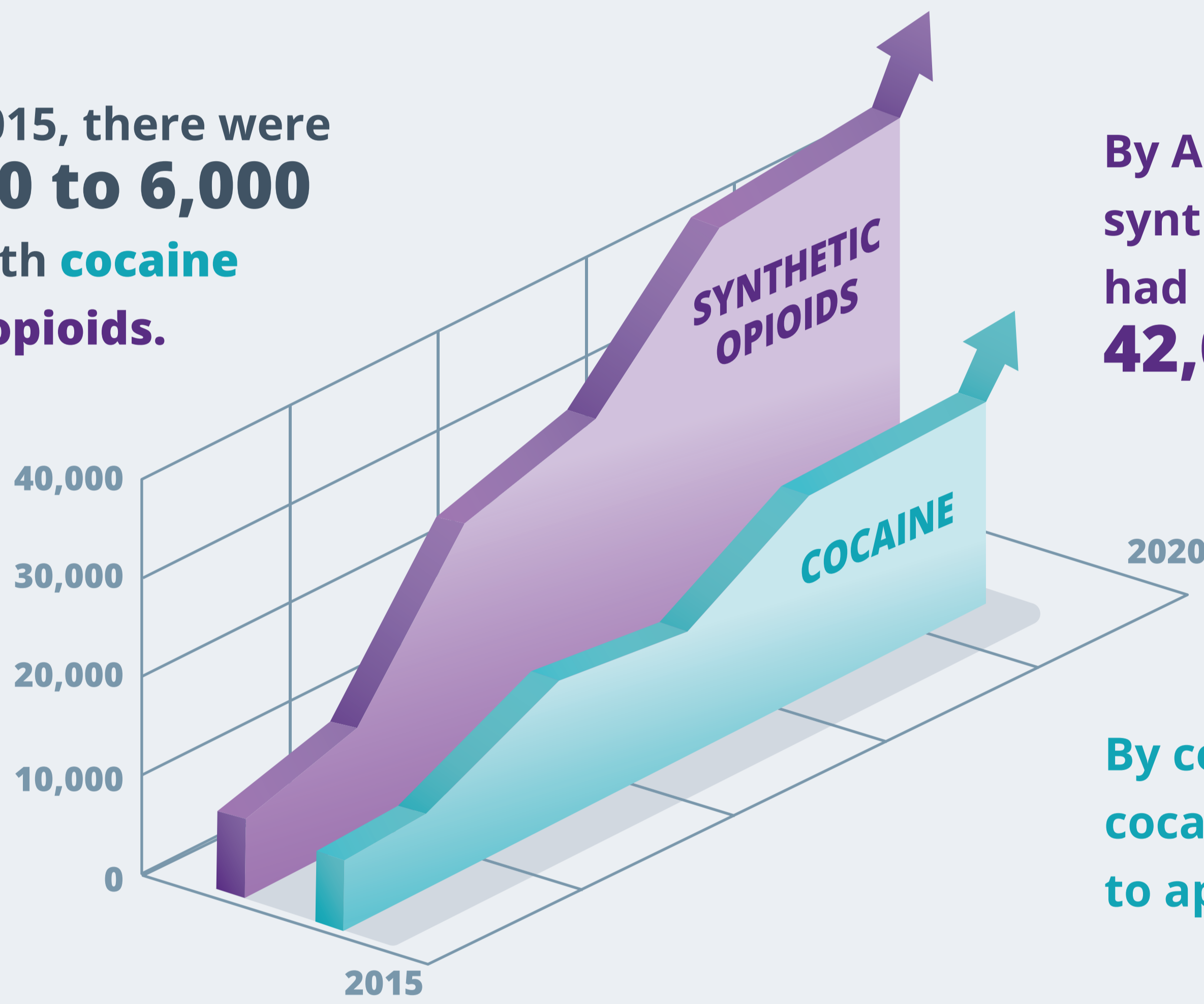
FLORIDA DRUG USE STATISTICS

OVERDOSE DEATHS

With drug addiction and overdose continuing to plague the United States, many people are realizing that the “War on Drugs” being waged by law enforcement is not doing enough to reduce these numbers.



In January of 2015, there were between **5,000 to 6,000** deaths from both **cocaine** and **synthetic opioids**.



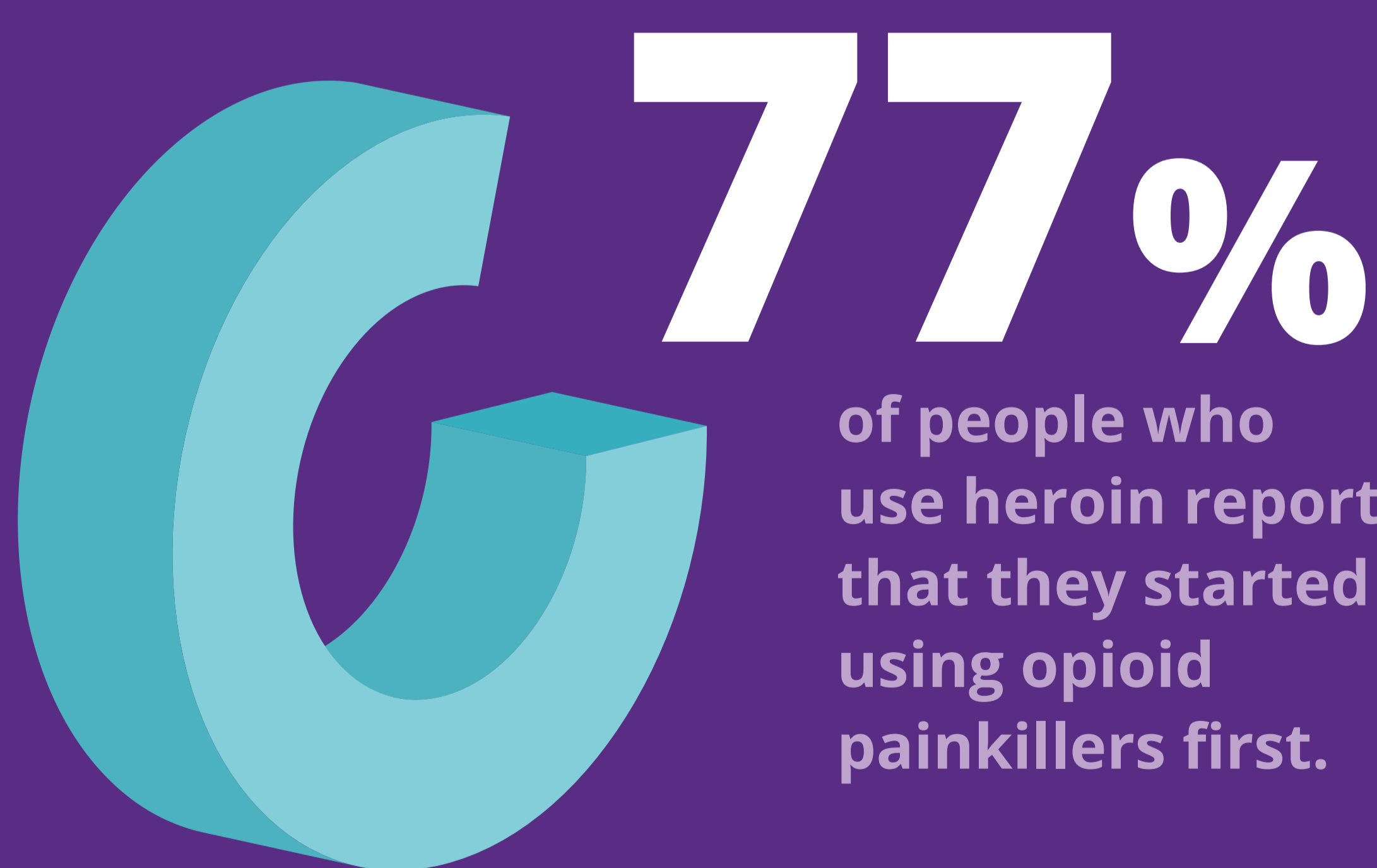
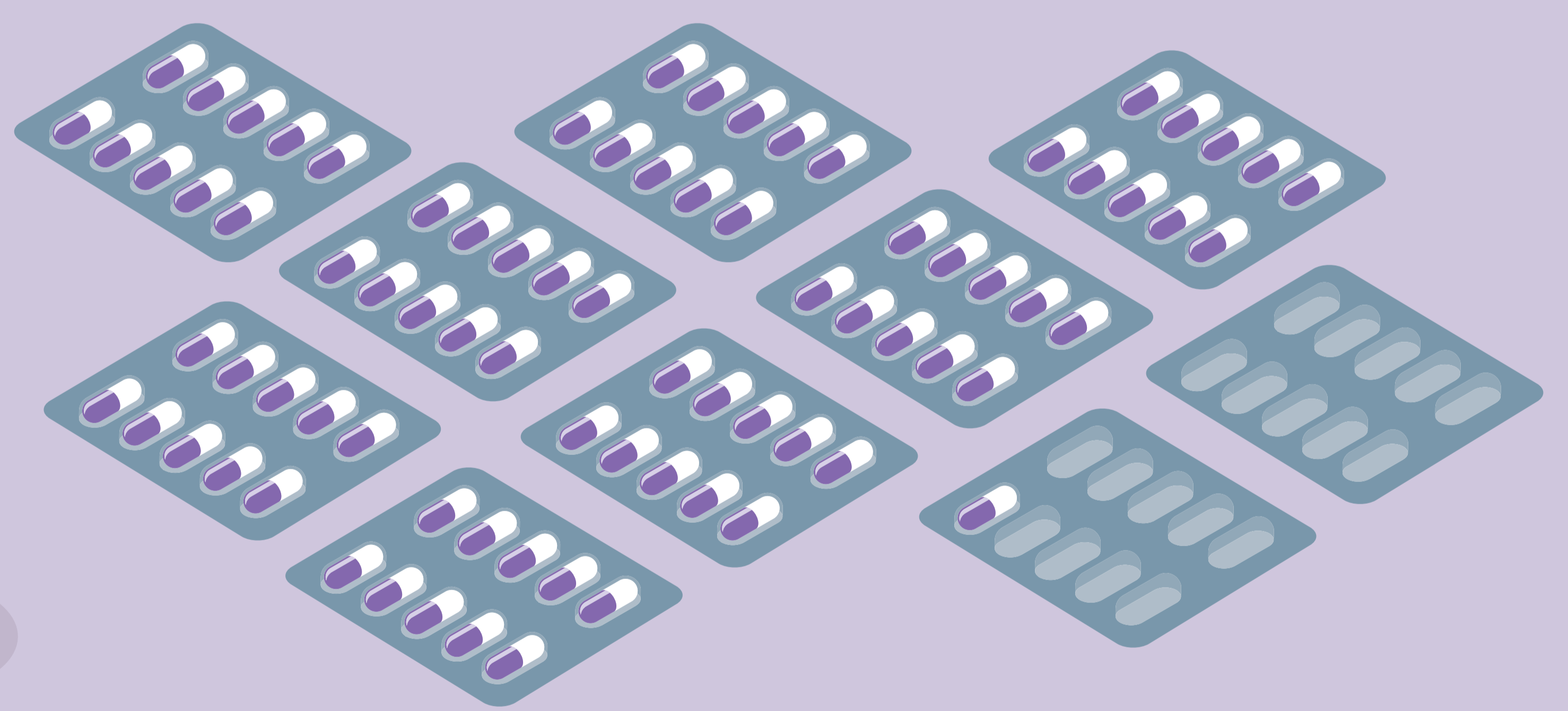
By April of 2020, the number of synthetic opioid overdose deaths had risen to approximately **42,000**.

By contrast, the number of cocaine overdose deaths rose to approximately **18,000**.

PRESCRIPTION OPIOIDS AND DRUG ABUSE



The number of opioid prescriptions peaked in 2012. There were, on average, enough prescriptions given out that **81 out of 100 people** could have one.



Those who develop addictions to prescription painkillers are **40 times more likely** to be addicted to heroin.
